Where to send orders for injected or infused specialty medication

Aetna Specialty Pharmacy will fill orders for:

- Antivirals (Fuzeon)
- Asthma therapy (Xolair)
- Blood thinners (Arixtra, Fragmin, Lovenox, Innohep)
- Chemotherapy
- Hormone therapies
- Intravenous immune globulins (IVIG)
- Hematopoietics (Neupogen, Neumega, Neulasta, Aranesp, Epogen, Procrit)
- Growth hormone
- Interferons (Actimmune, Infergen, Intron-A, Peg-Intron, Pegasys, Roferon-A)
- Multiple Sclerosis therapies (Copaxone, Betaseron, Avonex, Rebif)
- Respiratory Syncytial Virus therapy (Synagis)
- Rheumatoid Arthritis infused therapies (Remicade)

As the member's physician, you may prescribe:

- Antibiotic, antiviral, or antifungal therapies
- Continuous anticoagulant infusion therapy (Heparin)
- Chelation therapy
- Diuretic IV therapy
- Intermittent antiemetic therapy
- Sympathomimetic/inotropic agent therapy (Dobutamine)
- Pain management therapies
- Tocolytic therapy
- The intravenous nutritional supplement TPN (Total Parenteral Nutrition)

How to easily place an order

- Go to www.aetnaspecialtypharmacy.com
- Visit the "Welcome packet & forms" area to select and print the appropriate Medication Request Form
- Indicate delivery arrangements and patient or caregiver contact information on the form
- Fax completed forms to **1-866-FAX-ASRX (1-866-329-2779)**

Submit medical exception or precertification requests for drugs on the National Precertification List in one of three ways:

- **Fax** – Send your request to the Precertification unit at **1-866-267-3277**
- **Phone** – Call the Precertification unit at **1-866-503-0857**
- **Online** – Visit www.aetna.com and:
 - Select "Health Care Professionals" then "Medical Professionals Log In" to access our secure provider website.
 - Select "Plan Central" then "Aetna Health Plan."
 - Select "Aetna Support Center" then "Pharmacy." Scroll down to access the Online Drug Medical Exception/Precertification Request Form. The secure format lets you complete the form with the required information and submit it to us easily.
 - To check the status of a precertification request, select "Precertifications."
